On several occasions, I saw both of these cars in the garage at Chief Bolton's personal residence.

On one occasion, Chief Bolton told me to get a check engine light on the Mercedes checked at the dealer. To comply with that direction, I took the Mercedes to RBM of Atlanta and stayed with it most of the day, while it was repaired. The County paid for the dealer to do an oil change on the car.

In early April, 2008, I took the Range Rover to get it detailed, at Chief Bolton's direction. The detailing cost about \$100 and was paid for by the County.

Chief Bolton would ask me to clean up the seized luxury vehicles in his possession once or twice a month. I would take the cars to Swifty car wash and pay for the work out of my own pocket.

On a Friday or Saturday evening in the fall of 2008, Chief Bolton called me and instructed me to remove the Range Rover and Mercedes from the garage at his residence. Chief Bolton told me to contact Deputy Chief Donald Frank, because he had a place to put the two
