Around November of 2008, Sgt. Brannon and I removed the cars from Deputy Chief Frank's garage and parked them at a County building, the Burgess building. At Deputy Chief Rancifer's direction, I later assigned those two cars for use in Narcotics work.

When Keisha Williams began working for DeKalb County in 2007, I assigned her a car. I was told to put blue lights and a siren on it. I spoke with Chief Bolton to raise concerns about the assignment of a vehicle with blue lights and siren to Ms. Williams. I believed the assignment of a car with such equipment to Ms. Williams was illegal and/or inappropriate because she was a civilian. After I raised these concerns, Chief Bolton became upset with me.

*In the summer or fall of 2008, Chief Bolton called me and told me that he wanted me to get Keisha Williams a new car. This happened shortly after a representative of the news media saw Ms. Williams get into her police vehicle outside a bar. I then assigned Ms. Williams a different car, at Chief Bolton's direction.*

All Police Services cars must be assigned to a cost center. However, Chief Bolton told me in 2007 that he did not want any cars assigned to his cost center. At that time, I removed all of the cars from Chief Bolton's cost center, including the one assigned to Keisha Williams, and assigned them to different cost centers.
