Below is the script of a robocall that we are delivering to voters in your district. I wanted to make aware of this. If you have any questions or would like to discuss anything about these messages or our goal for the calls, please feel free to contact me.

As a member of the conference committee for HB 142, I hope you will take a strong stand for meaningful limits on lobbyist gifts to public officers, which should include limits on group expenditures and all costs related to travel for official duties.

The people of Georgia voted for such limits this summer, including 5,217 voters in your district, many of whom will receive our calls over the next few days.

For your convenience, I have enclosed the Georgia Alliance for Ethics Reform's suggested amendments, which have been distributed to you and other members of the legislature earlier this session.
